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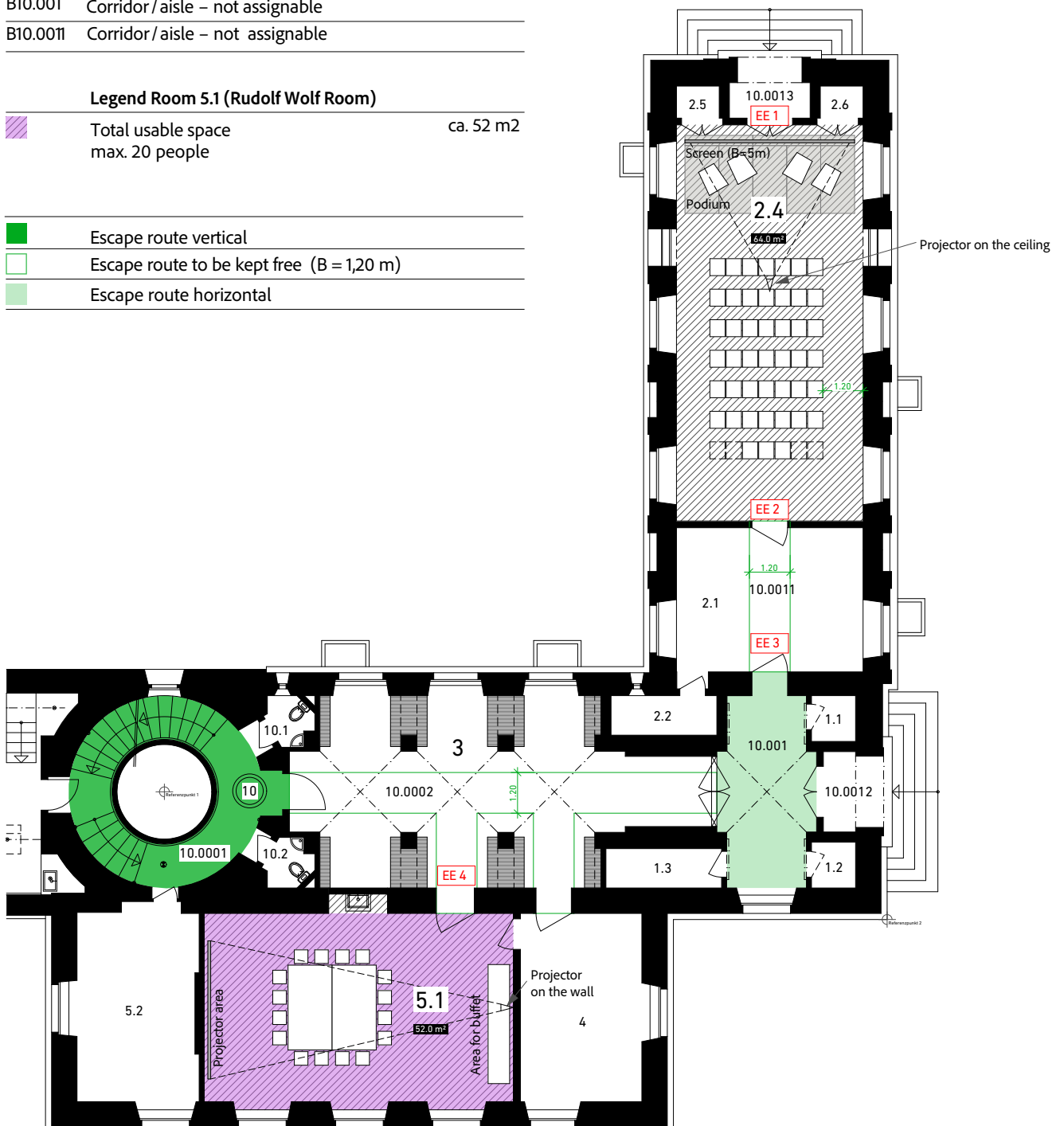

as part of an event taking place at the Collegium-Helveticum / Observatory

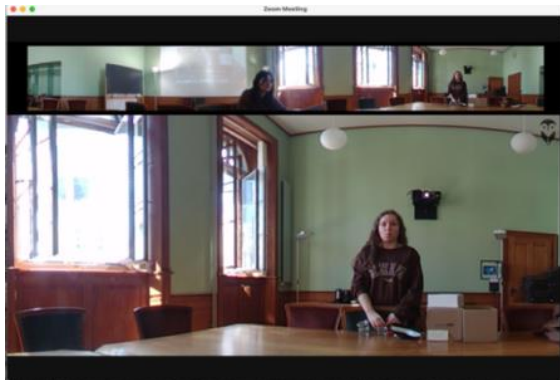
360° Videoconferencing System «Meeting OWL Pro» (Rudolf Wolf Room)

The event takes place on-site in the Rudolf Wolf Room. It does not necessarily have to be a conference per se, it can also be a lecture or another event format. The video conference simply allows for virtual participation.

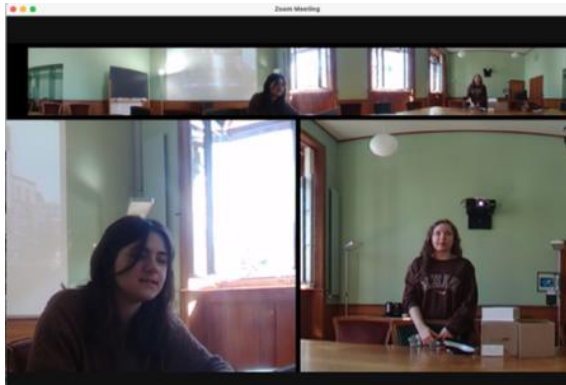
This is a real hybrid version: the virtual participants see and hear all people present on-site and vice versa.

The OWL works best in small discussion rounds of 10–15 people, which fit comfortably around the table in the Rudolf Wolf Room. Using the presentation laptop (on-site), virtual participants are connected via zoom or teams and can participate virtually in the event. Using the screen share function, the virtual participants are projected onto the screen on-site and are thus visible to those present on-site. The sound of the virtual participants can be heard via the OWL, which combines a loudspeaker, a microphone, and a camera. The sound of the people present on-site is simultaneously recorded by the OWL and sent to the virtual participants. Via the OWL camera, all participants present on-site are visible to the virtual participants. The OWL's camera has a 360° lens and is sound-sensitive. This means that all participants are visible in a panoramic view at the top of the screen. As soon as one ***1** or more people ***2** start to speak, the image is split at the bottom and these people become visible in a larger size. The OWL ***3** can ordered free of charge from the ETH MMT Shop.
